Next semester, Angelika Zirker will be offering an online course on "The Theory and Practice of Annotation: Philology and the Digital Humanities". The class will be concerned with the history of annotation from a philological and hermeneutic perspective as well as with using a number of tools in order to try and see what annotation tools can actually 'do' — and compare the results yielded by annotating a text. The corpus for annotation will be Charles Dickens's *The Chimes* (1844).
