One of our PhD students recently published [Self-Annotated Literary Works 1300-1900: An Extensive Collection of Titles and Selected Metadata](#), which lists more than 1100 literary works that feature self-annotations, i.e. marginal notes, footnotes, or endnotes written by the author of the work. The collection also provides information on the layout of these self-annotations and lists a wealth of secondary literature on the topic of authorial annotation. It is available as pdf, HTML file, XML file, and Microsoft Access file.
