Calls for Papers

The Journal for Technological Assessment in Theory and Practice (TATuP) is calling for abstracts for the special edition of in Volume 31, Issue 3 (2023) headed "Assessing the (de)construction of technological hypes". The TATuP Special will focus on 'hypes' and 'overpromising' in order to gain deeper insight into dynamics and mechanisms that shape the hyping of language and practices. All about annotation is the 17th Linguistic Annotation Workshop (LAW-XVII) that will take place July 12-14, 2023, at ACL in Toronto, Canada.
